Travel to Japan!

In 2007 former Yokkaichi Mayor Tetsuo Inoue proposed that a delegation of Long Beach students travel to Yokkaichi to discuss environmental problems and solutions with students from Japan and China in cooperation with the Port of Long Beach and other environmental groups.

Each summer four students and a chaperone from Long Beach take part in this annual environmental summit. High school students from Long Beach, Tianjin, and Yokkaichi stay together at ICETT (International Center for Environmental Technology Transfer) in Yokkaichi and come to understand each other by sharing opinions about earth environmental problems.

Expenses, including round-trip airfare, are the responsibility of the students and chaperone. All applicants must have a current passport and have no visible tattoos.
